Approval of last Meeting's Minutes	December's minutes were approved with a 10-0 vote.
Financial Update	Dr. Poll reported that school spending is still on track with our budget.
Academic Update	<ul> <li>2nd Term Academic Data</li> <li>Dr. Poll presented second term GPA data (the 2.58 school average is lower than normal).</li> <li>The total number of F's issued during second term is currently at 554.</li> <li>Dr. Poll emphasized that both numbers will improve as students and teachers work to improve second term grades over the next few weeks.</li> <li>It was noted that the majority of F's issued were in the 7th grade and attributed to a switch to the Summit learning platform. (Term benchmarks are not a part of the Summit program, which measures learning on a yearly basis. So many of these failing grades will change as the 7th graders reach their Summit learning targets later in the year.)</li> <li>The number of F's issued in 7th grade increased from 176 (in 2020) to 316 this year, a reflection of the change to the Summit platform.</li> <li>The push to raise grades prior to the winter holiday was very successful as mentoring classes worked to reach goals.</li> <li>SEL Survey Data</li> <li>About 392 students responded to this month's SEL Survey which was modified slightly from 2nd term.</li> <li>The first five questions continued to show student recognition and positive coping strategy selection by students at NDJH.</li> <li>The final question on the survey was expanded to gauge student perception of adult/friend mentors, both within the school and from other places.</li> <li>Students still recognized a trusted mentor especially regarding bulling at school and schoolwork. (the new question indicated a slight preference for mentors outside of the school framework).</li> <li>The percentage dropped when asked about concerns at home and mental health issues.</li> <li>Favorable responses dropped to about 50% when asked about enjoying school.</li> </ul>

SIP Goals for 2021-22	<ul> <li>School Improvement Plan goals were reviewed and discussed.</li> <li>The Council agreed to keep the focus areas of  - Student growth as measured by end of level testing.  - 95% of 9<sup>th</sup> graders credit proficient when entering high school.  - ELL student improvement as measured by WIDA test.</li> <li>9<sup>th</sup> grade credit deficiency was discussed, and 72 students have been identified as "credit deficient" at some point this year. Each student has been assigned a mentor from the admin/counseling team.</li> <li>NDJH works closely with the high schools to ensure that students have the resources to graduate.</li> <li>ELL performance on the WIDA test can be unreliable as students know that a good score could result in their removal from the program. (Dr. Poll is trying to find a way to allow high scoring students continued access to the ELL resources.)</li> <li>Next year's budget is estimated to be \$108,000.</li> </ul>
Counseling Department	<ul> <li>Counselors have been visiting elementary schools to meet and enroll next year's 7<sup>th</sup> graders.</li> <li>The department is working to get into classrooms to address SEL needs.</li> <li>SEL Survey data will be evaluated to customize classroom presentations over the remainder of the year.</li> </ul>
After-School Program	<ul> <li>After-School attendance has increased since the new year began in January.</li> <li>The program still has "rights" to the play and will provide the opportunity for students to participate this year.</li> </ul>
PTA	There are various positions that remain unfilled on next year's PTA.
Other Items	There were no other items discussed in February.
